

OUR RESPONSE TO COVID-19



“For over a year, it’s been an all hands on deck approach,”

says Unity Health Toronto President and CEO Dr. Tim Rutledge. “We’ve brought together our experts in emergency planning, infection prevention and control, and clinical care. These teams have worked tirelessly to guide everyone through the pandemic and selflessly care for the community.”

Since the onset of COVID-19, St. Joe’s has:

- Created COVID and non COVID areas;
- Created space to expand the Emergency Department by almost 40% to provide spaces for COVID and non-COVID patients needing emergency care;
- Opened a Respiratory Assessment Zone in the Emergency Department to specifically treat patients with cold and cough symptoms; and
- Opened a vaccination clinic on January 9 to vaccinate our staff, other healthcare workers and priority groups.

All this while caring for patients with other health concerns.

St. Joe’s is proud to be part of Unity Health Toronto, along with St. Michael’s and Providence, in tackling the third wave of the pandemic. Here is a snapshot of how many of our neighbours we’ve supported at St. Joe’s since the pandemic was declared in March 2020.

Feeding the frontlines

At the start of the pandemic, our donors made it possible for us to initiate a program to support our frontline workers called Breakfast of Champions. By the end of the year, almost \$140,000 was raised to provide thank you breakfasts and one thank you dinner for our teams. Donors also contributed treats and other wellness items for staff.



In January, to help celebrate and kick-off 100 years of care at St. Joe's, donors Marilynne Day-Linton and Bill Linton donated a free breakfast to all hospital staff, and this past March, with support from the Garron family, 2,225 lasagna dinners were distributed to staff to take home after their shift.

Bringing seasonal cheer to St. Joe's


Slaight Foundation supports our most vulnerable children

When Gary Slaight learned there was a mask shortage amongst children in our marginalized communities, he made a donation to support the production of more than 10,000 masks to be distributed to vulnerable children across the west end.

St. Joe's worked with a local supplier to make the masks and distribute them through the CIBC Just for Kids Clinic, our Family Medicine Unit, the Pediatric School Outreach program and a variety of local schools and local food banks.

Stories of Promise

Were you born at St. Joe's?

Do you have a loved one who receives care at St. Joe's?



"I always knew this is where I needed to be."

When Dr. Eddy Lau is not at St. Joe's, he is just a few blocks away from the hospital. "I have two daughters who have both received care at St. Joe's – so this place means a lot to me."

Dr. Lau came to St. Joe's more than 20 years ago. "I worked at three different hospitals before I chose to come here. St. Joe's is a great community hospital with a small-town feel, yet it is very academic and specializes in many areas – caring for kids being one of them. We can treat 95% of all paediatric conditions right here. As a parent in the neighbourhood, that's comforting to know because when your child is sick, you want them close to home."

The 100-year history of St. Joe's means something for Dr. Lau. "We get to care for children from the time they are born and see them grow up. Now we are celebrating 100 years of care – imagine how many lives started right here in this hospital? I can tell you the most rewarding thing is seeing a child get better. That's the best thing about my job."

"St. Joe's has been there for us when we've needed it."

Jim and Pam Gallagher made the west end home as newlyweds 45 years ago. They have seen the community grow and change. But one thing has remained – their support for St. Joseph's Health Centre.

"We have always relied on St. Joe's for emergency care. I remember a few difficult times when my mother was in Emergency. She was always treated kindly by the doctors and staff," says Pam. "Most importantly, they maintained her dignity and kept her from suffering and being frightened."

Jim and Pam are donors because they believe a community hospital is important for everyone. "We're glad to invest in St. Joe's for the next century," says Jim. "Our message in this anniversary year is one of thanks to the healthcare workers and staff at St. Joe's for all they have done. Let's look to the future together and celebrate the next century of care."

“The heart-warming displays of encouragement and gratitude from our community help carry us through so many tough shifts.”

The Bachir Yerex Family Dialysis Centre at St. Joe's is like a second home for our neighbours who need dialysis treatment. “Staff and patients think of each other as family,” says Solita Crispin, the patient care manager. “When you are with someone three times a week – some up to six times – for 3-4 hours at a time, the bonds between all of us grow deep. In some cases, we're the only family our patients know.”

Solita has worked at St. Joe's for 17 years, with the last year being the toughest. “The outpouring of encouragement from the community gets us through.”

She is proud of our community and happy to celebrate St. Joe's 100th anniversary. “St. Joe's embraces us for who we are, with different personalities and from different cultures. I hope that our diverse community remains confident in our health centre for the next 100 years that we'll be here for them.”

“Giving to St. Joe's is a family tradition.”

Pulling into her driveway, Jennifer Clarke thinks of her grandma. She sees her 10-year-old daughter Charley set up selling hot chocolate to people passing by. “My grandmother was new to Canada and didn't have much at all, but she always gave \$20 each month to charity,” she says. “Now to see my entire family doing what they can to help others is really touching.”

Charley says she is giving back to St. Joe's because of her two sisters Georgia and Jessica, twins who both needed extra care when they were born five years ago. “I remember going to visit them and everyone was really nice, so I want to help St. Joe's with things they need.”

Charley's fundraising, which has included hot chocolate and lemonade stands, as well as asking for donations instead of birthday gifts, has even inspired her two older brothers Blake and Connor – both who emptied their piggy banks to help. “Our family believes in giving back and St. Joe's is very special to us. I am very proud to see my children continue this wonderful tradition.”

What you are making possible

Under construction Thanks to your generous support, St. Joe's is building for the future to keep the Promise to meet the health needs of our west-end community for another 100 years. While construction was halted due to COVID-19, it is now resuming on the following facilities, which are now incorporating new features like partitions and distanced seating to keep our community safe.



Transitional Aged Youth Unit for at-risk youth

Construction continues on the RBC Transitional Aged Youth Unit to support youth at-risk between 16 and 24 who are transitioning from adolescent to adulthood and are most at risk for falling through the cracks in the system. St. Joe's is building the first hospital-based transitional aged youth unit in the GTA to help this vulnerable population get the care they need. The short-stay unit includes six beds for youth who have more complex needs and require private, targeted treatment. Other features of this healing environment will include a private interview and examination rooms, space for staff education and training, lounge space for youth and interactive video walls.

The Lakehouse Palliative Care Centre

Our new Lake House Palliative Care Centre is 15,000 square feet and includes dedicated spaces for both a 10-bed inpatient area and an outpatient clinic, as well as other cottage-inspired family spaces like The Great Room. Construction will begin in late spring and is expected to be completed in 2022. The vision and design of the space will replace the clinical feel and ensure both areas provide a serene and calm experience. The centre is inspired by the lake and will incorporate warm colours and soothing elements like a fireplace.



Dedicated centre for breast cancer screening and treatment

Construction will begin in late spring on The Geoffrey H. Wood Foundation Centre of Excellence in Breast Cancer Screening and Treatment. The construction is expected to be complete in 2022. The new centre will have two new mammography machines in dedicated suites for breast screening – one will open at the end of April in our current location and it will be moved to the new centre when it's ready. We will soon be able to offer breast tomosynthesis, the latest innovation in screening for breast cancer. This new technology will double our capacity for breast screening and will help better detect and pinpoint cancer.



Supporting St. Joe's for generations to come

Angelo Zis lives just five minutes away from St. Joe's. He says his family has been to St. Joe's Emergency Department several times and is always grateful for the care they receive. "Over the years, I've seen how much bigger and better St. Joe's has become and I know that's because of people who support the hospital," he says. "My entire family is dedicated to St. Joe's and it's why I decided to include St. Joe's in my will. It's my way of supporting my hospital for another 100 years."
