



The first phase of the Emergency Department redevelopment is now open. When the entire transformation is complete, the new Emergency will be more than 40% larger. It will include a dedicated children’s emergency, additional treatment spaces with better equipment, and expanded resuscitation areas to help continue to serve our more than half a million neighbours.

“He saved my life that night.”

Haley Camacho-Funk says she will never forget that weekend back in November 2020 when her health went downhill fast. She had intense chills and couldn’t find a way to warm up. A doctor at a walk-in clinic told her to get to the hospital right away, so she headed straight to St. Joe’s.

“Dominique Nguyen, one of the nurses in the Emergency Department, realized I was septic,” she says. “Within minutes, two doctors were explaining that how severe sepsis can be: your organs can start to fail. But as scary as it was, I knew I was in great hands with the team at St. Joe’s.”

Haley spent a week at St. Joe’s, but doesn’t know if she would have made it through the night if it wasn’t for Dom. “He saved my life.”



This enhanced clinic is now open, providing an essential service to patients with high-risk pregnancies. Thanks to you, the clinic space has a new ultrasound machine to monitor mom's condition. It's wonderful to offer a one-stop unit for mothers at higher risk in our community.

Our new Lake House Palliative Care Centre, with its cozy, cottage-inspired finishes overlooking Lake Ontario, will be the finest palliative care unit in the country. When open in early 2023, it will offer both inpatient and outpatient care, giving all our neighbours and their families choices. You are making this new centre possible, while also funding important training for our staff on advanced care planning and how to have difficult conversations with patients and families about their choices at end-of-life.

Brooke McClelland

After years of pelvic pain, multiple hospital visits and two surgeries, Brooke McClelland was so relieved to get answers at St. Joe’s. “When you have profound symptoms but no diagnosis, you feel helpless.”

Brooke was doubled over in pain at St. Joe’s Emergency where her journey began. It was team effort between gynecologist Dr. Suzanne Wong, Dr. Maria Melchior and Dr. Clarissa Bambao that led to the realization that Brooke had endometriosis. She needed what Brooke describes as “exceptional care and life-saving surgery” in the middle of the pandemic that took her pain away.
